The committee advised the State to bring the proposals for balance eligible unconnected habitations by end of November 2016.

### 4. Physical progress:

The Committee reviewed the progress of works and voiced its concern regarding the large number of incomplete works particularly those roads which are more than four years old and are incomplete and emphasized the need to complete these in a time bound manner.

The State Government has submitted completion plan in respect of 9 roads works which are more than 4 years old. As per the plan, out of 9 road works, 7 road works are schedule for completion by March 2017 and 2 by June 2017 due to re-tendering.

#### 5. DPR Issues on the current proposal

Technical observations of NRRDA on proposals based on the scrutiny of sample DPRs are:

- i. State has reduced Rs. 156.56 Crores after scrutiny. The corrected DPR costs needs to be updated on OMMAS by the State.
- ii. Average cost/Km of roads is still very high, which needs to be looked into.
- iii. Average cost of 9 road works in (5 in Stage I and 4 in Stage II) are more than 110 Lakhs/Km. These corrected DPRs needs to be verified at NRRDA.
- iv. L/S and C/S drawings enclosed with the DPRs are not legible.
- v. Earth work cutting quantity seems to be on higher side. Cutting and filling quantity should be a balanced one. Quantities of earthwork need to be rationalized for achieving economy in this item.
- vi. Ruling Gradient has been adopted for the entire stretch of the road. The State may explore the possibility of providing acceptable gradients (Limiting and Exceptional) wherever possible as per expert committee recommendations in order to economise the cost of construction.
- vii. The credit for hard rock in excavation has not been incorporated in many of the DPRs. Hard rock obtained from the cutting should be used for protective/drain works.
- viii. Detailed soil test results indicating LL, PL, sieve analysis for GSB material is not attached. Few samples need to be tested from STA Labs/Government Labs and attached with the DPRs.
- ix. As per Amendment No. 1/2009-10 issued in the file no. P-17012/7/2005/P-III dated 21.05.2009, the quantity of Well graded granular sub-base material should be taken as 360 Cum. However, the State has proposed 384 Cum. It needs to be modified.
- x. State should explore the possibility to provide Cement Treated Bases and Sub bases for which the pavement design catalogue is available with IRC: SP-72-2015. This may be cheaper than providing GSB/WBM layers and the requirement of aggregates are minimum. Stabilization techniques which do not need aggregates should be adopted for achieving economy in construction.

xi. Provision of OGPC should be changed to surface dressing for road having low traffic upto T5 category as per IRC SP:72-2015 (Cl 7.3.3) wherever possible. A saving of about Rs. 2.50 Lakhs to Rs. 3 Lakhs/Km could be achieved.

xii. Retaining walls and breast wall should be in dry masonry or with horizontal and vertical

bands in cement mortars.

xiii. Large number of CD works proposed with closer intervals and on higher side. Also, more length of Protective works have been proposed for State II construction. State should certify that no protective structures were sanctioned at these locations with Stage I proposal and all CDs/Protective works sanctioned in Stage – I project have been constructed and there is no savings.

xiv.CD works cost also higher when compared to other States. It should be verified and

rationalised

- xv. Pucca side drains proposed in arbitrary length. Locations of drains have not been specified in the DPRs.
- xvi. Provision of reflective sign boards is on higher side and arbitrary numbers provided and average cost per Km works out to Rs. 3.86 Lakhs/Km. (Eg Rs. 115.47 Lakhs for 17 Km length). Needs to be verified and reduced according to site requirement.

xvii. Provision of court yard and raising platform has been made in the DPRs. Provision for passing places have already been included in the main estimate itself. These Provision needs to be justified.

viii. Comparative statement of cost as per conventional design of CC pavement and

design using Cell filled concrete be provided. xix. STA signed Proforma C for 31 works have not been uploaded on OMMAS.

xx. Images for all roads have not been uploaded on OMMAS. It needs to be verified and uploaded on all proposed roads

The State representative informed that most of the above issues have been addressed and sent a compliance report to NRRDA. The Committee advised NRRDA to ensure that the compliance report is examined and communicated to the State before the EC Meeting.

#### 6. R & D Proposals

The State has proposed 12 roads for a length of 119.53 km under R & D with New Technology

and the details are as under:

State has not proposed cement stabilization in any of the proposal. Further, the State has not proposed any roads against 10% of Main streaming technology as per new technology initiative guidelines

#### 7. Quality

While reviewing the quality monitoring mechanism in the State, the Empowered Committee noted with concern that Quality Assurance Mechanism in the State needed substantial improvement. The Committee also observed that the first and second tier quality monitoring mechanism needs to be strengthened. Based on OMMAS data, out of 38 packages, field lab has not been established for 12 packages (32%).

As regards submission of Action Taken Reports (ATR) of NQM inspections, out of 19 ATRs required during the years 2010-11 to 2015-17, ATRs on 16 works are still pending. The State was advised to liquidate all ATRs of more than 6 months period by 30<sup>th</sup> November 2016.

### Recommendations of the Committee:

After due deliberation, it was decided that the State will complete following activities as agreed to by the State to consider for fixing an early date for Empowered Committee Meeting.

 The State would reconcile the habitation master on OMMAS based on the data prepared by the State and approved by NRRDA;

ii. NRRDA would examine the compliance report on technical observations of NRRDA and communicated to the State before the EC Meeting. The State would accordingly correct the DPRs, wherever required;

iii. The State would send the details of 9 ongoing works, which have been sanctioned prior to March 2012 along with completion plan.

iv. The State would liquidate substantial ATRs of more than 6 months' period by

30th November 2016.

- v. The State had made a commitment vide letter No. B-15028/4/11/PMGSY/EC/PWD/Mon Dt. 25.2.2013 from the Principal Secretary to the Government of Mizoram, Public Works Department, Mizoram that 679 CD works, which were sanctioned in Stage-I and not constructed earlier would now be constructed from the State Budget. The State should furnish a status of such construction to the Ministry.
- 12. The State should send a compliance report to the Ministry on all issues as indicated at **para** 11 above while seeking date for EC meeting.
